Private Employers Important Dates

<u>Mar. 31</u>

- One Claim Program (OCP) training requirement deadline
- Drug-Free Safety Program (DFSP) annual report due
- EM Cap safety training requirement deadline



Safety Intervention Grants Program

- Purchase equipment to eliminate or significantly reduce hazards in the workplace.
 - ~ 3:1 match up to \$40,000
 - Renewable every 3 years
 - One year case study/annual report
 - In business for one year



Safety Intervention Grants Program

Items Not Eligible

- Equipment primarily necessary for the business (e.g., forklift).
- Items that are not engineering controls (e.g., PPE).
- Items that don't directly reduce workplace risk factors (e.g., lighting).
- Other items outside the scope of the program (e.g., insurance).
- Equipment intended to meet minimum OSHA compliance, including basic machine guarding devices and equipment, standard guardrailing systems, etc.

Strategies

- Reactive
 - On-Site Physical Therapy
 - Transitional Work Programs

Benefits of Strategies

- Decreases OSHA Recordables
- Decreases Workers' Compensation Premiums
- Decreases Likelihood of Re-injury
- Increases Productivity
- Improves Employee Satisfaction

BWC Transitional Work Grant

- Grant money available to pay for the cost of developing a comprehensive return-to-work program for work-related injuries.
- Includes the following:
 - Policy, Procedure and Reporting Development
 - Job Analyses
 - Training
 - Establishing On-Site PT (optional)

OSHA First Aid

- Evaluating workers complaining of discomfort before seeking medical treatment
- Providing treatments within the OSHA First Aid Guidelines
 - Education
 - Non-rigid support
 - Hot or Cold Pack
 - Massage / Cupping
 - Compression sleeves
 - Counter-force splints
 - Kinesiotape
- If resolves with OSHA First Aid, then not OSHA recordable and not Workers' Comp claim.

Pre-Shift Stretching Programs

- 5-7 minutes of stretching prior to the shift
- Has been shown to increase flexibility/range of motion, manage pain/disability, and improve employee self-worth when implemented properly.

Micro-Stretching Programs

- Quick stretching (10 seconds) of working muscles every hour
- Promotes blood flow, muscle relaxation and flushing of lactic acid and waste products from the muscle tissues
- Has been shown to reduce Workers' Comp claims by 37%; lost time claims by 59%; MSD lost days by 78%

Functional Movement Screens

- Identifies compensatory movement patterns that are indicative of increased risk of injury and inefficient movement
- Identifies imbalances in mobility and stability during seven fundamental movement patterns
- Corrective exercises are prescribed
- Has been shown to reduce injuries in physically demanding jobs (Firefighters)

BWC Safety and Health Consultants

- BWC's safety and health professionals are available for consultations to help employers reduce workplace injuries and illnesses
 - Safety and Health Consultations
 - OSHA On-Site Consultation Program consultations
 - Public Employment Risk Reduction Program (PERRP) consultations

BWC Wellness Grant

- Assists employers with the creation and implementation of a workplace wellness program to meet the challenges of obesity, rising incidence of chronic diseases and the aging workforce
- Participating employers may receive \$300 per participating employee over a four-year period, up to a maximum amount of \$15,000 per policy
- Funds are used to compensate the external wellness program vendor for providing HRA biometric screenings and subsequent activities (Biometric screenings, Smoking cessation classes which may include smoking patches, Weight management classes, Weight loss challenges, Exercise classes, Nutrition classes, Walking programs, Lunch and learn, and Disease prevention training)

On-Site Physical Therapy

- Offering injured workers the option of participating in therapy at the workplace
- Has been proven through numerous peer-reviewed journals to
 - 1) Reduce costs associated with workers' comp claims
 - 2) Reduce the number of light-duty workdays
 - 3) Reduce the likelihood of re-injury
- No out-of-pocket expense for the employer or injured worker

Transitional Work Program

- Comprehensive return-to-work program for work-related injuries that allows injured workers to return-to-work with restrictions
- Keeps the claim Medical Only
- Includes the following:
 - Policy, Procedure and Reporting Development
 - Job Analyses
 - Training
 - Establishing On-Site PT (optional)
